Scout Master Minute

I would like to thank everyone for a great Family Camp and Court of Honor. I would also like to thank everyone for the trust you have put in me to be your Scoutmaster. As I have discussed with the Committee and the Assistant Scoutmasters, goals that I have for the Troop early on include improving our Patrol Advisor method at meetings. Ideally each Patrol has a Patrol Advisor team of two ASM's with at least one being at every meeting and sitting with their Patrol during the Patrol Time of each meeting. Each Patrol Advisor will also work with the SPL and ASPL to help guide any of the Youth Leaders (Librarian, Historian, Scribe, etc.) that happen to be in their patrol.

Other goals include plenty of advance planning between the Scout in Charge and Adult in Charge of each outing to make sure that outings are planned in advance with permission slips issued in a timely manner and ultimately leading to fun, exciting, and successful outings. Adults in Charge need to remember how much time some Scouts need to plan events. After the event the Scout in Charge owes a write up to Mrs. Chang for the newsletter and the Adult in Charge owes a summary to Mr. Harrison for Troopmaster. The summary should include youth and adult attendance and any nights of camping or miles hiked or other special awards.

We are also working on improving our Youth Instruction. As the PLC decides on Instruction Topics, I will be soliciting an adult, ASM, Committee Member, or parent, to work with one or both of the Youth Instructors to help teach the Instructors on how to teach. Again, the planning for this program may take several weeks per instruction, especially if gear is involved or if the instruction is difficult. We have already had success with orienteering and flag instruction using this method.





Committee Chair's Corner

Rooted in Tradition – Embracing the future

A TRANSITION is the movement, passage or change from one position, state, stage, subject, concept to another.

In September we concluded the final transition from Scoutmaster Mr. Guerin to Scoutmaster Mr. Avery. Mr. Guerin joined Troop 726 when Seamus joined the troop in 2005; he became Scoutmaster in early 2006 and carried on the traditions of Troop 726 while taking on some important fundamental changes in leadership. When Mr. Guerin became scoutmaster, in 2005 the troop was rooted in heavy traditional thinking. The scouts and leaders were looking for new and exciting adventures; Mr. Guerin listened and took action. He soon added his flair to the program, breathing new life into the boys program and allowing them to feel the wind and soar. As Scoutmaster, Mr. Guerin guided 14 young men to the rank of Eagle, held over 200 scoutmaster conferences, and countless hours doing community service projects, outings and camping trips. He attended summer camp each year and was the leader on two big adventure trips. Mr. Guerin read the scouting books, listened to the scouts and then followed his heart to help provide a scouting program that the youth wanted to be involved in and more important want to help guide.

A TRADITION is a ritual, belief or object passed down within a society, still maintained in the present, with origins in the past. A tradition is a long-established or inherited way of thinking or acting.

As Mr. Avery takes the Scoutmaster position, I'd like to welcome him, remind him of our traditions and invite him to create some new traditions. Mr. Avery was the cub master of pack 705 and joined our troop when Mitch crossed over from cub scouting to boy scouting in 2008. Mr. Avery quickly joined the committee side of the troop and then became our Advancement Chair in March 2009. Mr. Avery has been very active as Advancement Chair and attended many outings. Since accepting the call to be Scoutmaster, Mr. Avery has completed the training necessary to be fully trained in the position of Scoutmaster.

I'd like to ask all our scout families to acknowledge the traditions while embracing the future changes.
