

Trip Itinerary (Prepared by Mr. Andrews)

08/07 Sunday 08:30am - depart Masonic Center Castro Valley

- 580 East to 205 East to 120 East to stop at Yosemite Big Oak Flat entrance
- Follow Big Oak Flat Road past Crane Flat to stop at Valley View turnout
- Continue through tunnels, then left on Northside Drive
- Go right toward Bridalveil Falls, then sharp right on Wawona Road
- Stop at Tunnel View parking lot
- Return to Bridalveil parking lot and hike to base of falls
- Continue right on Southside Drive stopping for El Capitan & Yosemite Falls views
- Arrive at Upper Pines Campground after 03:00pm
- Time allowed for hiking Lower Yosemite Falls trail or visitors center tour

08/08 Monday 06:00am - depart camp for Happy Isles

- Hike Mist Trail past Vernal & Nevada Falls to climb Half Dome summit for lunch
- Return in the afternoon via John Muir Trail to conserve energy
- Plan B: catch shuttle bus to hike Upper Yosemite Falls trail out to Yosemite Point

08/09 Tuesday 09:30am – depart Yosemite Valley camp

- Return on Northside Drive stopping for El Capitan & Yosemite Valley views
- Go right on Big Oak Flat Road to Crane Flat and turn right on Tioga Pass Road
- Continue to stop at turnouts for Olmsted Point overlook and Tenaya Lake
- Continue to Tuolumne Meadows for short hike to top of Pothole or Lembert Domes
- Follow over Tioga Pass to Lee Vining and turn left on 395 North
- Stop at Mono Basin Scenic Visitors Center
- Return south on 395 past Mammoth and Bishop to Lone Pine for dinner
- Drive up Whitney Portal Road past Movie Flat Road to Mt Whitney Campground

08/10 Wednesday 10:00am – depart Mt. Whitney Campground for Whitney Portal

- Secure Mt Whitney climbing permits and backpack to High Camp for early dinner
- Plan B: hike off Movie Flat Road to Natural Arch

08/11 Thursday 06:00am - depart High Camp on Mt Whitney eastern slope

- Climb hard to summit for early lunch
- Return to High Camp and backpack out to Whitney Portal
- Plan B: Drive 395 North to 168 East for Ancient Bristlecone Pine Forest hike
- Evening drive on 136 East to 190 East for Death Valley
- Continue over Panamint Range, through Stovepipe Wells and south to Furnace Creek
- Arrive at Furnace Creek Campground

08/12 Friday 09:30am - depart Furnace Creek Campground

- Tour Visitors Center and drive 190 East to Zabriskie Point and 20 Mule Team Canyon
- Return south on 178 to Artists Drive and Badwater
- Continue on 178 South to Shoshone and on to Las Vegas for the wknd
